

## Answers to Some Common Park Questions

**Volunteer**: Guests as well as POA residents are encouraged to volunteer. Postings for volunteer opportunities are on the bulletin board outside of the POA office in the clubhouse building. Check it out and feel welcome to sign up!

**Purchase Tickets**: Canteen, Celebration dinners, special events all require tickets to be purchased. Tickets for your event are sold daily Monday thru Friday from 10 am – 12pm. There will be someone at the desk in the library outside of the POA office in the clubhouse building to assist your ticket purchase.

Need Extra Table and Chairs: These are available for residents' to use. Sign out in the POA Office.

Medical and Baby Equipment: These are available for residents' to use. Sign out in the POA Office.

Bath House Bulletin Boards: These are located at each bath house and are reserved for PARK FUNCTIONS ONLY. Please do not put personal flyers on them.

Club House Bulletin Boards: Both the Pool House and Clubhouse have bulletin boards that are available for both personal and community flyers. Please keep the flyers to ½ page.

Wheel and Transport Chairs: These are located inside the west side door, for your use, at the clubhouse.

#### FROM THE DESK OF JOHN SIMS.... PARK MANAGER

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving, and you have an even better Christmas! We have so many new property owners that I wanted to get some information out to them and our new renters.

The house trash/garbage goes in the dumpsters at the top of the hill by the maintenance building. The county is no longer recycling. Cardboard also goes in the household trash, NOT in the home goods or construction containers at the bottom of the hill.

NOTE: Every time a property owner or renter throws household trash/garbage in the containers at the bottom of the hill. It cost an additional \$250.00 per container to the POA.

There are signs in front of the containers that show what you can & cannot put in those containers

Please remember the speed limit is 15 MPH. Also when clearing behind your property you can only go 10 to 15 feet onto common ground and you can only clear the underbrush, no trees or large bushes, if you want to clear more than that, you have to have board approval. If you cut down a live tree you have to replace it with another tree. These are some of the things new property owners and renters are not getting. # Beware of Holiday Scams Don't Let Your Holidays be Stolen

Sadly, 'tis the season for scams, as cybercrooks cook up schemes to exploit our holiday habits.

A few scams are specific to the holidays, but most are variations on everyday frauds, ramped up to match seasonal spikes in spending and web traffic. Not surprisingly, they often center on shopping, <u>especially online</u>.

Two-thirds of consumers expect to buy gifts mostly online this season, according to research company Ipsos' 2021 holiday survey, and nearly 3 in 5 are doing so more than they did before the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### Keep Your Guard Up for These Scams

- •Charity scams: One-third of all charitable giving is done in December, fundraising software company Network for Good reports. That means more sham charities exploiting Americans' goodwill via fake websites and pushy telemarketers. This is the most common holiday con, the AARP poll found, with 38 percent of respondents saying they've received a dubious donation request.
- •<u>Delivery scams</u>: As holiday packages crisscross the country, scammers send out <u>phishing emails</u> disguised as UPS, FedEx or U.S. Postal Service notifications of incoming or missed deliveries. Links lead to phony sign-in pages asking for personal information, or to sites infested with malware. A third of those surveyed by AARP said they've experienced a delivery scam.
- •Travel scams: Despite the pandemic, 46 percent of U.S. adults plan to travel during the holidays in 2021, a SurveyMonkey poll found. Spoof booking sites and email offers proliferate, with travel deals that look too good to be true and probably are.
- •Letter from Santa scams: A custom letter from the jolly old elf makes a holiday treat for the little ones on your list, and many legitimate businesses offer them. But so do many scammers looking to scavenge personal information about you or worse, your kids or grandkids, who may not learn until many years later that their identity was stolen and their credit compromised.
- ·If you encounter a holiday scam, file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission
- · (online or at 877-382-4357) and report it to your state's attorney general and consumer protection office

# "Critter" of the Month Great Egret

#### Description: Great Egret

Visit a Florida pond or coastal marsh and look for an all-white bird—slightly smaller than a Great Blue Heron, with black legs, S-curved neck and a yellow, daggerlike bill. It may be wading slowly or standing stock-still, peering intently at the water as it searches for fish, using stand and wait techniques.

#### **Fun Facts: Great Egret**

- The Great Egret is the symbol of the National Audubon Society, one of the oldest environmental organizations in North America. Audubon was founded to protect birds from being killed for their feathers.
- Great Egrets fly slowly but powerfully: with just two wingbeats per second their cruising speed is around 25 miles an hour.
- The oldest known Great Egret was 22 years, 10 months old and was banded in Ohio.






## **VETERANS CEREMONY & RESIDENTS' MEMORIAL EVENT**
