## Camp Florida Drone Operation Guidelines

- All recreational flyers must pass a safety test and provide proof of passage. The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST) was developed to meet this requirement.
  - o You may take the free online test through any of the FAA approved test administrators.
  - o All FAA-approved TRUST test administrators offer the test free.
  - o All test questions are correctable to 100% prior to issuing your completion certificate.
  - o After completing TRUST, you will need to download, save, or print your completion certificate.
  - o If you lose your certificate, you will be required to re-take TRUST.

## • First-Time Pilots must:

- o Operators must be 16 years old.
- o Operators must be able to read, speak, write, and understand English.
- o Operator must be in physical and mental condition to safely fly a drone.
- o Pass the initial aeronautical knowledge exam: "Unmanned Aircraft General-Small (UAG)"
- o You must have your Pilot certificate available at all times while flying your UAS.

## • Requirements for Remote Pilot Certificate:

- o Must be easily accessible by the remote pilot during all UAS operations
- o Certificate holders must complete an online recurrent training every 24 calendar months to maintain aeronautical knowledge recency.
- If your drone weighs more than .55 lbs., you must register your drone through the FAA's Drone Zone.
- Drones are to be flown for Recreational purposes only.
- You must keep your drone within the visual line of sight at all times.
- Drones must be flown above roof top levels to protect property owners' personal privacy.
- Drones cannot be flown above 400 feet, which is considered restricted airspace.
- Drones cannot be flown within 1000 feet of the eagle's nest during nesting season which runs from October 1<sup>st</sup> until May 15<sup>th</sup>. This would prohibit flying a drone over the pool area, storage area, club house building, etc. which are all within the 1000 feet eagle restrictions.
