# Park Manager's Message - John Sims

It is hard to believe it is March already. Not a great winter weather season even though it is better than most. Some of our northern family will be leaving this month so here are some items to do before you leave. You are responsible for the appearance of your property. If you have a concrete pad that hasn't been pressure washed, please do so before you leave or have someone do it as soon as possible after you leave. If you have a park model and haven't had it pressure washed, please do it. With our hot and humid summers, it won't take long to turn green. Weeds are the responsibility of the property owner. The weeds grow fast in the summer rain and humidity. Please secure a contract with someone to take care of your weeds during the summer months. The maintenance crew can be hired for a fee to take care of your weeds on their OFF TIME. If you have an empty pad, turn off your water and lock your electrical box if you aren't going to be renting your lot. If you have a park model make sure someone has a key in case of an emergency and have to enter your residence. Shut off your water but do not lock your water meter as it belongs to the water company. Remove any outside furniture items that could become flying objects during a hurricane or severe thunderstorms. If you are leaving a boat and trailer or just a cargo trailer, please tie them down before you leave. On another note, dog complaints are always an issue in this park. If you are in a dog circle your dog has to be on a 6 foot leash before you exit your camper or park model. That is park rules and county law and it is the one thing that can get your dog or ESA Service animal removed from the park. Pick up your dog POOP and have your dog on a six foot only leash at all times. Those of you that don't follow the rules make it difficult for those that do. If you want a dog park, prove to everyone that you can follow the rules because there will be rules at a dog park. Thank you and have a good summer.

### CRITTER of the Month

The American Flamingo, (Phoenicopterus ruber) - Quite honestly, I chose this beautiful creature because I remember them as "lawn ornaments" and they always seemed to be depicted as being native to Florida. So I started to read about them and it turns out that the FWC (Florida Fish and Wildlife) considers flamingos native to Florida but disappeard from the state around the turn of the 20th century. After about 1925, people started captive colonies of flamingos in South Florida, including a breeding colony at Hialeah Park Race Track in the 1930s which still remains.

The American flamingo is one of the largest species averaging up to 5 feet tall because of its long legs and elongated neck. They get their mostly pink to red plumage color from pigment in their food, including aquatic invertebrates, such as shrimp. I can't begin to cover all of the facinating information that is available from the links below so do yourself a favor and visit.




